Orange Village encourages all residents to recycle as much as possible, not only in your recycle container but also with composting bins and grasscycling. Grasscycling is the natural recycling of grass by leaving clippings on the lawn when mowing. Grass clippings decompose quickly, returning valuable nutrients back to the soil.



In 2014, Orange Village residents diverted over 412 tons of recyclable materials from the landfill. This effort saved the Village over \$17,000. I would like to commend you on your efforts! Everyone reaps the long-term benefits of recycling.

What your recycled items become...

Newspapers = Phone book, egg carton, building insulations, construction paper, berry boxes, paperboard, kitty litter, paper plates and new newspapers.



Paperboard (cereal and shoe boxes, etc.), Unwanted Mail = Paper backing on roofing shingles, paper towel roll and new paperboard



Magazines = Paperboard, phone book and newspaper

Cardboard = Paper bags, paperboard and new cardboard

Aluminum Cans = New aluminum cans

Metal Cans = Bike parts, car parts, steel beams, rebar, appliances, new cans



Notebook Paper and Computer Paper = Facial tissue, toilet paper, paper towels, napkins, new notebook paper and new computer paper

Plastic Beverage Bottles = Carpet, backpacks, polar fleece, sleeping bag and ski jacket insulation



Plastic Detergent, Milk and Juice Bottles = Plastic lumber, play sets, buckets, frisbees, stadium seats and new bottles

Glass Bottles & Jars = Fiberglass, new bottles and jars

Curbside Refuse and Recycling Collection

Orange Village provides weekly curbside collection of refuse and recyclables through its contract with Kimble Recycling & Disposal, Inc.

All material is collected from your home on the same day. Collection for Orange Village is on **Monday** except when a holiday falls on a Monday; then collection will take place on Tuesday. Below is a list of holidays when collection will take place on Tuesday.

Memorial Day, Monday, May 30 • Independence Day, Monday, July 4 • Labor Day, Monday, September 5

Ordinance 939.02

- Refuse and recyclables should be placed on the tree lawn near the street by 7:00 a.m. the day of your collection.
- Trash containers are not to be placed curbside prior to 4:00 p.m. on the day before any scheduled collection day.
- All containers must be removed from the curbside prior to 10:00 a.m. the day after any scheduled collection day.
- All perishable trash placed curbside should be placed in a container which is not susceptible to being opened or destroyed by animals.

Placement of Your Refuse and Recycling Containers

Kimble Recycling & Disposal supplied refuse containers to all homes in Orange Village. All refuse containers are the property of Kimble and should remain in the home. Please place your containers 2 feet from the street with the lid opening facing the street and 3 feet from other objects. Please place recycling on one side of your driveway and trash on the other.



Recycling Container

Orange Village provided recycling containers for all residences. You are able to mix all acceptable recycling materials together and place them in this container. Please do not line the container with plastic. Do not place recyclables in plastic bags. For your convenience, there is a label on the container listing recyclable materials. Please note that you CAN place phone books in this container. **All containers are the property of Orange Village** and should remain with the home. If you do not have a recycling container, please contact Village Hall at 440-498-4400.

LIST OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS THAT ARE ACCEPTED BY KIMBLE RECYCLING & DISPOSAL

Plastics #1 through #7 are accepted. Examples include the following:

1. Soft drink bottles, water bottles, peanut butter jars, window cleaner bottles, mouth wash bottles
2. Laundry detergent bottles, windshield washer fluid bottles, coffee containers, milk jugs, butter tubs, medicine bottles
3. Shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles, hand soap bottles, plastic container lids, and juice bottles



4. Mustard bottles, margarine and ice cream tub tops, squeezable bottles
5. Cool whip containers, plastic flower pot containers, apple sauce cups, plastic cups
6. Plastic cookie tray dishes, vegetable tub containers, take-away containers
7. Orange juice plastic bottles, kids snack containers, some ketchup bottles

Holiday Tree Recycling

Orange Village Service Department will be collecting your natural holiday trees on specified Mondays in January. The trees will be chipped instead of using valuable space in the landfills. Please prepare your tree for collection by following these simple guidelines:



- * Place tree with trunk facing the road.
- * Remove lights, ornaments, tinsel and other trimmings from branches.
- * Remove tree stands, metal or wood.
- * Do not bag your tree.

Recycle Your Holiday Lights

Did you find strings of holiday lights that are old or no longer working? Orange Village Service Department will accept them every Friday from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm January 8th and 15 and during the months of November and December. Drop off your old lights, power strips and power cords at the Orange Village Service Department Recycle Center, 4680 Lander Road, to be recycled.



Household Hazardous Waste: First Friday of Every Month

The Orange Village Service Department will accept unwanted oil-based paint, pesticides and other household hazardous wastes. You can tell if a product is hazardous if words such as POISON, DANGER, WARNING and CAUTION appear on the label.

Antifreeze - If you are connected to a sanitary sewer, antifreeze may be diluted with water and flushed down an inside utility drain. Do not use an outside storm drain. **If you use a septic system, do not flush antifreeze down any drain.** It may be included in the household hazardous waste collection.

***How to decide if you have latex paint:** Look for "latex" on the label. If the paint is cleaned up with water, it is latex and can be disposed of in your regular trash collection as long as it is solidified first.

Miscellaneous Items for CURBSIDE Pickup

The following items may be placed at the curb on pickup day.

If the items are large, as a courtesy, please contact Kimble Refuse directly at 1-800-201-0005 to notify them of an “oversized” pick-up.

Latex Paint is a non-hazardous material and can be disposed of with your regular trash, **once it has been dried**. To dry or harden latex paint add sand, sawdust, plaster of paris, vermiculite, cat litter or a paint hardener (available at hardware stores). For small amount of latex paint (1” or less), remove the lid and allow paint to air dry. Place cans of latex paint curbside without the lids.



Syringes & Lancets **must be disposed of safely**. Place them in a “sharps container”, such as an empty 2 liter pop bottle or empty detergent bottle (labeled “SHARPS”). Secure the cap, then dispose with your regular trash.



Cooking Oils should not be disposed of down your drains. The oil should be collected in clear plastic containers that have been **clearly marked cooking oil** and disposed of with your regular trash.



Carpeting & Padding will be taken on your regular collection day if it is neatly rolled or folded and tied in pieces no longer than 4 feet and weighing no more than 50 pounds and placed at the curb.



Household Appliances, such as washers, dryers, etc. will be picked up on your regular collection day. Doors must be removed from refrigerators/freezers. If you would like to donate your small appliances, working or non-working and under 20 pounds, they can be dropped off at Cuyahoga County Solid Waste Management District, 4750 E 131st Street, Garfield Hts., Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 4:30pm.



Ordinary household batteries, such as alkaline, may be disposed of with your regular trash. Rechargeable batteries should be recycled.



Furniture and Mattresses (must be covered in plastic and taped closed) should be placed on the curb on your regular collection day. Keep in mind you may also donate your gently-used furniture for reuse. Visit the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District’s website at www.cuyahogaswd.org for more information.



Lumber & Wood Building Materials must be cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled with non-metallic ties. Plaster and roofing material must be boxed, bagged or bundled weighing no more than 50 pounds. For safety, please remove all nails from any building materials. This is a service for our residents, it is not intended for use by contractors.

- ◆ When you place an order, we will ask you to describe where to place the delivery as if you were standing at the street looking down your drive toward your home.



A friendly reminder to turn your clocks forward one hour Saturday evening, March 12th. Daylight savings time officially begins

at 2:00 am, Sunday March 13th. This is also a great time to change your batteries in your smoke detectors.



Tips to Shrink Your Energy Bills

- ★ **Close Damper on Chimney** - A tightly closed damper prevents up to 8% of furnace heated air from going up the chimney.
- ★ **Seal Air Leaks** - Sealing the air leaks can save 10% or more on heating bills.
- ★ **Tune-up Furnace / Seal Ductwork** - Furnace tune-ups save up to 10% on your heating bill / sealing ductwork saves from 3% to 10%.
- ★ **Attic Insulation** - You can save up to 30% on your energy bills with added insulation.
- ★ **Purchase Energy Star Products** - If you are looking for a new clothes washer, dryer or kitchen appliance consider purchasing Energy Star rated items. A Energy Star clothes washer can save you \$110 annually and a refrigerator can save \$80 per year.
- ★ **Energy Efficient Water Heater** - An efficient electric water heater can save up to 20% on water heating bills.
- ★ **Storm Windows** - You can reduce heat loss by 25% or more by adding storm windows.

Branch and Brush Collection

The Orange Village Service Department will offer residents several opportunities to have their branch and brush collected. We will be collecting branches and brush on April 25th, June 6th, July 25th and September 12th. This service is to aid the residents in the management of tree prunings and limbs that have fallen from their trees.

This service is not intended to chip complete trees.

If you are removing a tree from your property or having one removed, please work with your contractor to manage such material.

Brush Pickup Requirements

In an effort to provide residents with the highest level of service and to minimize the risk of injury to employees or damage to equipment, the following regulations will be strictly enforced:

- No foreign material (i.e. rope, metal, wood posts, construction wood, split rail fence, railroad ties or any material that could contain nails or metal, stumps and root balls).
- DO NOT mix leaves, grass clippings or yard material with branches.
- DO NOT place out any material with thorns.
- Limbs shall be placed with cut ends towards the road, no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide. Piles must be able to be picked up by one person.



Wood Chips... Orange Village delivers the wood chips that are collected during the branch chipping free of charge to residents. An approximate load size is 10 yards. Requests are honored in the order they are received, while supplies last. Place your order online at www.orangevillage.com or call Village Hall at 440-498-4400.

- Long lengths are acceptable, if they can be handled by one person.
- Limbs should be no larger than 6" in diameter.
- Small material shorter than 2 feet in length shall be bundled or placed in a container.
- Branches should not be placed roadside any more than a few days before the scheduled chipping date. However, branches must be out by the Sunday prior to the scheduled date. The Service Department makes one complete pass through the Village beginning on the scheduled day and ending once a complete pass of the Village has been made.
- Branches placed out too early or too late must be removed by the resident.

Medicine Disposal - Rx Drug Drop Box Program



Orange Village Police Department and Cuyahoga County are pleased to announce a collaborative effort to protect your home and the environment from potentially dangerous medications with the Rx Drug Drop Box Program. Law enforcement is the only entity legally able to accept these medications and process them properly so that they do not fall into the wrong hands. Law enforcement takes control of and destroys drugs on a regular basis as part of their ongoing operations.



The RX Drug Drop Box Program is an opportunity for residents to deposit unused, unwanted, or expired prescription drugs. You may drop off your items Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm at Orange Police Department, 4600 Lander Road. **Needles and liquids cannot be accepted.**

How To Dispose of Latex Paint

Orange Village does **not** accept latex paint in the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program because it is not a hazardous material. Latex paint (a.k.a. water-based, acrylic, or emulsion paint) is comprised mostly of water and can be safely disposed of in your household trash as long as it is solidified first. Listed below are ways to solidify latex paint:

- **Air dry.** Remove the lid and allow the liquid to evaporate. This works well for small quantities of paint (an inch or two in the bottom of the can), and can take several days.

- **Use a drying agent.** Mix an equal amount of an absorbent material into the can and allow the paint to dry. Use cat litter, sawdust, plaster of Paris, Oil-dri, or “waste paint hardeners” found at home improvement centers. The paint could dry quickly, depending on how much drying agent you include in the can.



- **Pour thin layers** (about 1” of paint) into a cardboard box lined with plastic. Allow the paint to dry one layer at a time until all paint has hardened.

Once the paint is thoroughly dry, place it in a regular trash bag and put it out with your Monday rubbish collection.

Scrap Tire Collection - September 1st through September 30th

According to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, about 70 percent of Ohio's scrap tires are being recycled. These tires are retreaded; made into new products; or used or mixed with other solid fuels to produce electricity in industrial boilers and cement kilns. Another 38 percent are shredded for use as a substitute for gravel in landfill drainage systems.

Nationally, only 26 percent of scrap tires are recycled to make new products.



Orange Village Service Department will collect scrap tires that are removed from the rim. They may be dropped off at Orange Village Service Department Recycle Center from September 1st through September 30th from 7am - 3pm.

Leaf Collection Begins Monday, October 17th

Orange Village Service Department collects leaves and turns them into a rich compost that can be added to gardens and soil. They will begin on October 17th and run through November 23rd. This compost will be delivered to residents who request loads. Please see March for more information on ordering leaf humus.

How To Place Leaves for Pickup

- Leaves should be placed close to the edge of the road. They should not extend into the road.
- Leaves should be in a long row no farther off the road than 8 feet.
- Do not mix branches or foreign objects with the leaves. This can cause damage to the machine.



TELEVISIONS AND OTHER ELECTRONIC RECYCLING



Looking to recycle that old television or electronics item? You have many options, though television recycling is not a free service in Cuyahoga County. County-sponsored collection events are not held for televisions, and they cannot be included with Orange Village's free computer recycling program. Televisions can be recycled at your local Best Buy store. There is no fee, just bring the television to Best Buy for recycling. Best Buy also offers free recycling of upright vacuum cleaners, fans, pedometers, heart rate monitors and more. Visit www.bestbuy.com/recycling for a complete list of what they will accept for recycling or trade-in.



Small household appliances can be recycled at the Solid Waste District. The small appliances must be clean and under 20 lbs., working or non-working. Items can be dropped off for recycling in the District's lobby at 4750 East 131 Street in Garfield Heights. Hours are Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

How to Dispose of Fryer Oil

Over 2 million people across the country deep-fry their turkey every Thanksgiving and cleaning up can be troublesome. With 3-to-5 gallons of used oil on your hands, disposing of it isn't as easy as just chucking it in the garbage. And don't even think about pouring it down the drain!

Fryer Oil should be collected in clear plastic containers that have been **clearly marked cooking oil** and disposed of with your regular trash.



CFL Fluorescent Bulbs

When a compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulb burns out it may smoke and the plastic base may blacken. This is normal. CFL's should never be discarded with the household trash. Home Depot® and Lowe's Home Improvement stores offer free in-store recycling of consumer compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and plastic bags. Place the bulbs in the recycling centers located in each store.



A CFL has a small amount of mercury, and a few precautions should be taken in case a bulb breaks. If a CFL breaks have people and pets leave the room and open a window to allow the room to air out for 5-10 minutes, turn off air conditioning or heating, collect the broken glass and visible powder using stiff cardboard, tape or a damp paper towel, place the debris in a glass container with a metal cover or a sealable plastic bag. **DO NOT VACUUM**, if possible. Place container outside in trash.

Household Hazardous Waste and Computer/E-scrap Collections will take place the first Friday of every month at the Service Department Recycle Center, 4680 Lander Road. We will also collect old holiday lights, power strips and power cords November 4, 11 & 18 and December 2, 9 & 16.

While most charities will provide a receipt for your donation, most will not appraise the value of donated items.
