## Curbside Refuse and Recycling Collection

### Curbside Refuse...

Orange Village provides weekly curbside collection of refuse and recyclables through its contract with Kimble Transfer & Recycling.

All material is collected from your home on the same day.

Collection for Orange Village is on **Monday** except when a holiday falls on a Monday then collection will take place on Tuesday. Below is a list of holidays when collection will take place on Tuesday.

*Memorial Day, Monday, May 27, 2013 • Labor Day, Monday, September 2, 2013*

### Ordinance 939.02

- Refuse and recyclables should be placed on the tree lawn near the street by 7:00 a.m. the day of your collection.
- Trash containers are not to be placed curbside prior to 4:00 p.m. on the day before any scheduled collection day.
- All containers must be removed from the curbside prior to 10:00 a.m. the day after any scheduled collection day.
- All perishable trash placed curbside should be placed in a container which is not susceptible to being opened or destroyed by animals.

### Placement of Your Containers



To ensure automated refuse service and pricing, please place your container 2 feet from the street with the lid opening facing the street and 3 feet from other objects.

If at all possible, please place recycling on one side of your driveway and trash on the other.



### Recycling Container

Orange Village provided recycling containers for all residences. You are able to mix all acceptable recycling materials together and place them in this container. Please do not line the container with plastic. For your convenience, there is a label on the container listing recyclable materials. Please note that you CAN place phone books in this container. **All containers are the property of Orange Village** and should remain with the home. If you do not have a recycling container, please contact Village Hall at 440-498-4400.



The Orange Village Fire Department collects aluminum beverage cans for recycling. All profits benefit the *Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation*. If you would like to separate these cans from your other recyclables, please pack them in blue plastic bags and drop them off at the Fire Station located at 4600 Lander Road or deposit them in the recycle bins located at the south entrance to Village Hall near the Fire Station.

## ***Holiday Tree Recycling***

Orange Village Service Department will be collecting your natural holiday trees on specified Mondays in January. The trees will be chipped instead of increasing valuable space in the landfills. Please prepare your tree for collection by following these simple guidelines:

- \* Place tree with trunk facing the road.
- \* Remove lights, ornaments, tinsel and other trimmings from branches.
- \* Remove tree stands, metal or wood.
- \* Do not bag your tree.



## **Tips to Shrink Your Energy Bills**

- ★ **Close Damper on Chimney** - A tightly closed damper prevents up to 8% of furnace heated air from going up the chimney.
- ★ **Seal Air Leaks** - Sealing the air leaks can save 10% or more on heating bills.
- ★ **Tune-up Furnace / Seal Ductwork** - Furnace tune-ups save up to 10% on your heating bill / sealing ductwork saves from 3% to 10%.
- ★ **Purchase Energy Star Products** - If you are looking for a new clothes washer, dryer or kitchen appliance consider purchasing Energy Star rated items. A Energy Star clothes washer can save you \$110 annually and a refrigerator can save \$80 per year.
- ★ **Attic Insulation** - You can save up to 30% on your energy bills with added insulation.

## Miscellaneous Items for CURBSIDE Pickup

The following items may be placed at the curb on pickup day.

If the items are large, as a courtesy, please contact Kimble Refuse directly at 1-800-201-0005 to notify them of an “oversized” pick-up.

**Latex Paint** is a non-hazardous material and can be disposed of with your regular trash, **once it has been dried**. To dry or harden latex paint add sand, sawdust, plaster of paris, vermiculite, cat litter or a paint hardener (available at hardware stores). For small amount of latex paint (1” or less), remove the lid and allow paint to air dry. Place cans of latex paint curbside without the lids.



**Syringes & Lancets** **must be disposed of safely**. Place them in a “sharps container”, such as an empty 2 liter pop bottle or empty detergent bottle (labeled “SHARPS”). Secure the cap, then dispose with your regular trash.



**Cooking Oils** should not be disposed of down your drains. The oil should be collected in clear plastic containers that have been **clearly marked cooking oil** and disposed of with your regular trash.



**Carpeting & Padding** will be taken on your regular collection day if it is neatly rolled or folded and tied in pieces no longer than 4 feet and weighing no more than 50 pounds and placed at the curb.



**Household Appliances**, such as refrigerators, washers, dryers, freezers etc. will be picked up on your regular collection day. **Remove all doors from refrigerators and freezers.**



**Ordinary household batteries**, such as alkaline, may be disposed of with your regular trash. Rechargeable batteries should be recycled.



**Furniture and Mattresses** should be placed on the curb on your regular collection day. Keep in mind you may also donate your gently-used furniture for reuse. Contact the Cleveland Furniture Bank at 216-459-2265, ext. 101 to schedule a pickup for a fee of \$20. You may also deliver the furniture.



**Lumber & Wood Building Materials** must be cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled with non-metallic ties. Plaster and roofing material must be boxed, bagged or bundled weighing no more than 50 pounds. For safety, please remove all nails from any building materials. This service is not intended for use by contractors.

### Spring Forward - Daylight Savings Time Begins

## Computer Recycling - April 1 - 30 and August 1 - 30

Acceptable computer equipment includes: CPU's, monitors, keyboards, mice, printers, terminals, modems, cables, software. Cell phones and their accessories are also accepted.



Computers will be accepted at Orange Village Service Department Monday through Friday, April 1 - 30 and August 1 - 30, from 7 AM to 3 PM.

## Paper Shredding April 20<sup>th</sup> and October 19<sup>th</sup> at Orange Village Hall 9:00 am - 12:00 pm

Orange Village will be providing residents with opportunities to have their sensitive documents professionally shredded. Paper shredding is a secure way to dispose of documents without fear of sensitive information being released into the wrong hands, while creating less of an impact to the environment. The items will be shredded in your presence with a camera for your viewing. If you are unable to attend the shredding dates, we will have secured containers for drop off of your materials the Thursday and Friday prior to the shredding date. ## Household Hazardous Waste: April 26<sup>th</sup>, July 12<sup>th</sup> and September 20<sup>th</sup>

The Orange Village Service Department will accept unwanted oil-based paint, pesticides and other household hazardous wastes. You can tell if a product is hazardous if words such as POISON, DANGER, WARNING and CAUTION appear on the label.

**Antifreeze** - If you are connected to a sanitary sewer, antifreeze may be diluted with water and flushed down an inside utility drain. Do not use an outside storm drain. **If you use a septic system, do not flush antifreeze down any drain.** It may be included in the household hazardous waste collection.

**\*How to decide if you have latex paint:** Look for "latex" on the label. If the paint is cleaned up with water, it is latex and can be disposed of in your regular trash collection as long as it is solidified first.

## Branch and Brush Collection

The Orange Village Service Department will offer residents several opportunities to have their branch and brush collected. We will be collecting branches and brush on April 29th, June 10th, July 29th and September 9th. This service is to aid the residents in the management of tree prunings and limbs that have fallen from their trees.

**This service is not intended to chip complete trees.**

If you are removing a tree from your property or having one removed, please work with your contractor to manage such material.

### Brush Pickup Requirements

In an effort to provide residents with the highest level of service and to minimize the risk of injury to employees or damage to equipment, the following regulations will be strictly enforced:

- No foreign material (i.e. rope, metal, wood posts, construction wood, split rail fence, railroad ties or any material that could contain nails or metal, stumps and root balls).
- DO NOT mix leaves, grass clippings or yard material with branches.
- DO NOT place out any material with thorns.
- DO NOT make large piles.
- Limbs shall be placed with cut ends towards the road, no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide. Piles must be able to be picked up by one person.
- Long lengths are acceptable, if they can be handled by one person.
- Limbs should be no larger than 6" in diameter.
- Small material shorter than 2 feet in length shall be bundled or placed in a container.
- Branches should not be placed roadside any more than a few days before the scheduled chipping date. However, branches must be out by the Sunday prior to the scheduled date. The Service Department makes one complete pass through the Village beginning on the scheduled day and ending once a complete pass of the Village has been made.
- Branches placed out too early or too late must be removed by the resident.

**Wood Chips...** *Orange Village delivers the wood chips that are collected during the branch chipping free of charge to residents. An approximate load size is 10 yards. ## Medicine Disposal

You may dispose of any prescribed or over-the-counter medication this is expired or no longer needed for medical treatment.



**Never flush unwanted medicine.** Wastewater treatment plants and septic systems cannot remove pharmaceutical compounds from the waste water so these chemicals pass through treatment plants or septic systems into Lake Erie, the source of our drinking water. These pharmaceutical compounds also pose a risk to aquatic organisms.

### **DISPOSE WITH YOUR HOUSEHOLD TRASH**

Unwanted medicine should be disposed with your household trash after taking the following precautions. These precautions will ensure the safety of children and animals and prevent misuse of the medicine.

- Keep the medicine in its original container. You may want to remove the label or conceal patient information or drug information with a marker.
- Before placing in the trash, make the medicine unusable by mixing in some coffee grounds or dissolving the pills with water and sealing the original container with tape. Liquid medicine should be placed in a sealed plastic bag.
- Place the container in durable packaging that masks the contents, such as a brown cardboard box.
- Place the medicine in your trash.

### **WAIT FOR A FREE COLLECTION EVENT**

The U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration sponsors drug take-back events a couple times per year. These events are held in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies. ## **Household Hazardous Waste: July 12th and September 20th**

The Orange Village Service Department will accept unwanted oil-based paint, pesticides and other household hazardous wastes. You can tell if a product is hazardous if words such as POISON, DANGER, WARNING and CAUTION appear on the label. Please drop these items off at the Service Department between the hours of 7:00 am and 3:00 pm.







### ***What kind of computer equipment can be recycled?***

Acceptable home computer equipment includes CPU's, monitors, keyboards, mice, printers, terminals, modems, cables, software, and ink printer cartridges. Cell phones and their accessories are also accepted.

Monday through Monday, August 1st through 30th  
7:00 am - 3:00 pm

### ***What will happen to the computers that are collected?***

If it is a Pentium III or higher it will be refurbished and placed in Ohio Public Schools or a needy non-profit. If it is a Pentium III running at a speed lower than 900 MHz it will be totally taken apart and recycled to its base parts. RET3 Job Corp may use the pieces and parts to rebuild other computers. Unrepairable equipment is completely deconstructed. If your donation does not meet school specifications, RET3 Job Corp. will recycle the equipment in a process that is fully compliant with EPA standards and offers a 100% no-landfill guarantee.

### ***What will happen to the data on my computer?***


All computer hard drives received by RET3 are erased of all data using U.S. Department of Defense specifications. This secure system eradicates all the information stored on your computer and protects your confidentiality. After the hard drive is cleaned, usable computer systems are remanufactured.

## Scrap Tires



According to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, about 70 percent of Ohio's scrap tires are being recycled. These tires are retreaded; made into new products; or used or mixed with other solid fuels to produce electricity in industrial boilers and cement kilns. Another 38 percent are shredded for use as a substitute for gravel in landfill drainage systems. Nationally, only 26 percent of scrap tires are recycled to make new products.



Orange Village Service Department will collect scrap tires that are removed from the rim. They may be dropped off at Orange Village Service Department September 10th through September 27th.

## Leaf Collection Begins Monday, October 21st

Orange Village Service Department collects leaves and turns them into a rich compost that can be added to gardens and soil. This compost will be delivered to residents who request loads. Please see March for more information on ordering leaf humus.

### How To Place Leaves for Pickup

- Leaves should be placed close to the edge of the road. They should not extend into the road.
- Leaves should be in a long row no farther off the road than 8 feet.
- Do not mix branches or foreign objects with the leaves. This can cause damage to the machine.



## CFL Fluorescent Bulbs

When a compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulb burns out it may smoke and the plastic base may blacken. This is normal. CFL's should never be discarded with the household trash. Home Depot® and Lowe's Home Improvement stores offer free in-store recycling of consumer compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs, rechargeable batteries, and plastic bags. Place the bulbs in the recycling centers located in each store. The bulbs will be managed responsibly by an environmental management company who will coordinate CFL packaging, transportation and recycling to maximize safety and ensure environmental compliance.



A CFL has a small amount of mercury, and a few precautions should be taken in case a bulb breaks. If a CFL breaks have people and pets leave the room and open a window to allow the room to air out for 5-10 minutes, turn off air conditioning or heating, collect the broken glass and visible powder using stiff cardboard, tape or a damp paper towel, place the debris in a glass container with a metal cover or a sealable plastic bag. DO NOT VACUUM, if possible. Place container outside in trash.

## Stop Unwanted Phone Calls



### **National “Do-Not-Call” List**

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC), in conjunction with the FCC, has a system for individuals to stop unsolicited commercial telephone calls. The FTC created a nationwide “Do-Not-Call” registry. List your phone number with the FTC and the telemarketers cannot contact you at the registered number. Register online at [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov) or call (888) 382-1222 from the telephone you wish to register.

Things to keep in mind about the “Do-Not-Call” registry:

- ① Allow up to 31 days from the time of registration for marketers to have removed your name from their contact lists.
- ① Various organizations do not have to comply with the FTC’s “Do-Not-Call” registry. These include the following:
  - Political organizations.
  - Charities, calling on their own behalf.
  - Survey companies as long as they do not try to sell you something afterwards.
  - Any company you have conducted business with within the last 18 months.
  - Any company that you called within the last three months can contact you with new information about its products.
  - Any company to whom you have given written consent, may call you.



**You can remove yourself from an individual company’s call list at any time. When receiving an unwanted phone call, politely ask the caller to remove you from their contact list. They must comply with your request.**

## How to Dispose of Fryer Oil

Over 2 million people across the country deep-fry their turkey every Thanksgiving and cleaning up can be troublesome. With 3-to-5 gallons of used oil on your hands, disposing of it isn’t as easy as just chucking it in the garbage. And don’t even think about pouring it down the drain!

Fryer Oil should be collected in clear plastic containers that have been **clearly marked cooking oil** and disposed of with your regular trash.

## Tax-Deductible Donations

Your donation of used goods may be tax-deductible. Below are some general tax tips related to donating. For complete information contact your accountant or tax advisor.

- All noncash donations require at least a receipt from the charity with name, date, and description of donation.
- Individual noncash contributions of \$250 or more must be substantiated with written acknowledgment from the charity.
- The Internal Revenue Service lets taxpayers claim the "fair market value" of the item at the time the donation is made. While most charities will provide a receipt for your donation, most will not appraise the value of donated items. To help you determine the value of your donation, you can obtain a copy of IRS Publication #526 (for individuals) or #542 (for corporations), entitled "Charitable Contributions" at <http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/p526.pdf>
- Contributions to civic leagues, social clubs and business leagues are not tax deductible; nor are donations made to for-profit thrift stores or merchandise sold on consignment.
